You get out of school and head straight to a convenience store. You are dying to get your hand on a bag of potato chips. When this happens, we generally assume we are hungry or perhaps have not been getting enough sodium in our diet. Most people share this belief that our cravings for certain foods are signals from our bodies.

Craving refers to an intense desire to consume a particular food that is quite difficult to resist.

___32____ For example, the craving for chocolate is thought to be a molecule that causes the brain to release "feel-good" chemicals. People think that our bodies crave food in order to remedy a nutritional deficiency. People, however, rarely claim to crave milk or yogurt.

So, why do we have cravings? The answer may have been found over a hundred years ago by the Russian scientist Ivan Pavlov. In his groundbreaking experiments, Pavlov showed that dogs could be conditioned to salivate when hearing a bell even in the absence of a food source. ____ 33___ For instance, through ads and movies we have been programmed to connect chocolate with romance. ____ 34___ The craving, therefore, is psychological, not physiological.

Understanding that our cravings stem from thoughts rather than a physical need is the first step in controlling them. ___35___ If you love spending time with family, try taking out fruit when you are together. Eventually, you may find that you have developed a craving for pineapple, melon, or mango rather than unhealthy foods.

(A) The Netherlands is a small country in northern Europe, with a coastline on the North Sea. The word "nether" means lower, or below, and much of the territory of the Netherlands is below sea level. Most of the rest of the land rises only a meter or two above the sea. Nearly the entire country is vulnerable to serious flooding, not just from the sea but from rivers. Throughout its history, the Netherlands has been engaged in a constant struggle to keep itself dry.

The earliest inhabitants of this low-lying land built their homes and communities on top of artificial earthen mounds, hoping to stay above the water. Through the years, people connected these mounds with bridges made of raised earth. When three communities were connected in a triangle, the pathways became dikes, protecting the interior of the triangle from flooding.

Keeping floodwater out was good, but these triangular enclosures also prevented rain and groundwater from draining, and the land became swampy, unproductive and unhealthy. The famous windmills of the Netherlands were the solutions. They were used to lift water up over the <u>dikes</u> and empty it into rivers and canals. Finally, the land could be used for farming. Over time, the system of dikes expanded, and more and more land was protected and made productive.

(B) All throughout this year, millions of fans worldwide will be celebrating the 25th anniversary of the Pokémon franchise. The Pokémon brand has become the highest-grossing entertainment franchise in just a quarter century. It comes out in the forms of media and merchandise, inclusive of video games, television, trading cards, toys, clothing, and accessories.

The concept of Pokémon originated in the late 1980s following the release of Nintendo's new handheld gaming console, the Game Boy. Inspired by the hobby of insect hunting and collecting, Japanese video game developer Satoshi Tajiri conceived a game in which the player wanders a fictional world fighting, collecting and training new species of magical creatures. The first Pokémon games, *Pocket Monsters Red* and *Green*, were released in Japan in 1996 and became huge sensations.

Since the series' initial release, Nintendo has published dozens of new titles with at least 900 unique Pokémon species inhabiting the vast Pokémon universe.

In October 1996, the Pokémon Trading Card Game (TCG) was launched and designed to mimic some of the game mechanics of the video game series. The Pokémon TCG quickly became a major commercial success, with packs of cards swiftly disappearing from store shelves all over Japan and North America. Millions of children and their parents notoriously spent huge sums of money on new card packs, hoping to gain particularly rare and valuable cards. Therefore, some critics questioned the ambition and motive of the Pokémon TCG, which was like gambling.

With a total of over US\$92 billion, its video game series is the second-best selling, behind only *Super Mario*. Premiering in 1997, the animated series follows the adventure of the young Pokémon trainer Ash Ketchum and his friends as they navigate the oftentimes hazardous Pokémon world. Even another themed version of the board game *Monopoly* appeals to countless players.

Pikachu, the most popular Pokémon character, is as instantly recognizable as other iconic fictional superstars like Mickey Mouse, Doraemon, Snoopy and Hello Kitty. However, the franchise has not existed without its share of controversy. Here is one dispute, for example, that the animal rights organization, *People for the Ethical Treatment of Animals* (PETA), has criticized the franchise for advocating animal cruelty, comparing Pokémon battles to dog fighting, circus acts and other forms of animal exploitation. Thus, this is worth reconsideration, for the plot of Micky Mouse, Doraemon, Snoopy or Hello Kitty is much more peaceful than that of Pikachu.

Today, the Pokémon brand is as popular as ever, with recent events helping to introduce the creatures to new generations of fans. In 2016, game developer Niantic released Pokémon Go, the wildly popular augmented reality smartphone game that allows players to encounter Pokémon in the real world. In 2019, Legendary Picture released *Detective Pikachu*, the first live action Pokémon feature film, to great commercial success. Now Pokémon UNITE, the latest and hottest game, is released for Android and iOS system in September 22, 2021. Don't miss it!


