Potato chips are popular all over the world and sold under many different names. They are also America's favorite snack food, and about 1.6 billion pounds of chips are eaten there every year. One might think that a genius came up with the idea for potato chips, but it didn't happen that way.

It is said that they were invented in 1853 by a cook named George Crum. He worked at a restaurant called Moon's Lake House in Saratoga Springs, New York. One evening, a very picky customer sent Crum's fried potatoes back to the kitchen, complaining that they were too thick. Not pleased, Crum made some thinner ones for him. However, the customer was still not satisfied. Crum was very angry, so he sliced the potatoes so thin that the customer wouldn't be able to eat them with a fork. To Crum's surprise, the customer was very pleased with them. No one could have imagined Crum's trick would have that kind of result. Soon, Saratoga Chips appeared on the menu and became **all the rage**. Following the popularity of the new dish, Crum opened his own restaurant in 1860. Before long, potato chips were being sold all over the USA.

At that time, making potato chips was a time-consuming job because the potatoes had to be peeled and cut by hand. That changed in the 1920s with the invention of the mechanical potato peeler. It paved the way for the mass production of potato chips. The delicious snack food gradually spreads to all parts of the world, and today, potato chips are more popular than ever.
