

Waste collector



Duty: Keeping streets clean, handling smelly materials, recycling

Risk: The deaths and injuries in this industry are mostly transportation related because they need to jump on and off a moving truck. The spill of harmful substances may also make them infected or sick.



Fishermen

Duty: laboring with enormous fishing nets and heavy equipment to fish on open waters.

Risk: When any accident occurs, medical assistance is not readily available. In addition, drowning is the leading cause of death since the weather condition on the sea is unpredictable.
